Through the Melvin Drum Memorial Scholarship fund, the Texas Chief Deputies Association provides (3) three scholarships to children of Sheriff's Office employees attending institutions of higher education as well as (1) one scholarship to a Sheriff's Office employee who is furthering their own education. The Texas Chief Deputies Association has an annual conference each year to advance these ideals and provide training to our membership. Any Sheriff that joins our Association can attend the annual training conference and his \$150.00 conference registration fee is waived! Membership dues are only \$24.00 per year pro-rated monthly.
